


Spider Web Intervals

Draw a line from the spider to all the matching intervals to create a spider web.



Augmented

Here is another example from the key of C major (and also in C minor):



With F as a key-note, the 4th degree of the scale would normally be B_{b} . The interval F- B_{b} is a perfect 4th. But the B_{b} has been raised a semitone (to B_{b}), so the interval has become larger, and perfect becomes augmented: F- B_{b} is an augmented 4th.


Diminished

There is another way of altering an interval. Instead of raising or lowering the *top* note, the *bottom* note can be raised or lowered.

If you raise the bottom note of an interval, you make the interval smaller.

If you lower the bottom note, the interval becomes larger.

So the above rules still apply. Look at this interval from B minor:
